1 THE PSYCHOLOGY OF EATING

(intermediate/advanced)

2 UNDERSTANDING AND INTERACTING EFFECTIVELY WITH INDIVIDUALS WITH AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDERS (Asperger’s Syndrome)

(basic - intermediate)

During this training, you will:

- Examine the current research and understanding of Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD) and compare that to neurotypical development
- Learn how social understanding and a variety of current strategies can lead toward effective social interactions between individuals with ASD and those who work with them
- Describe several differences between typical and autistic development

This is a practical presentation that will provide a new understanding and appreciation for those with ASD, as well as tools to use immediately at home or in the classroom with both children and adults.
